## 1. New Provincial Court Practice Directives

Since February 4, 2008, contested Notices of Motion and Notices of Application filed in the Provincial Court in Winnipeg have been returnable for any Monday to Thursday at 10:00 a.m. in Courtroom 308. The Provincial Court has recently finalized formal Practice Directives for the court in determining contested motions and applications and these will be implemented as of October 6, 2008. Information sessions for lawyers will take place in Room 413 of the Winnipeg Law Courts Complex from 12:00-1:30 p.m. on Tuesday, September 23, 2008 and again on Thursday, September 25, 2008. #### 2. Criminal Code Provisions in Force

On October 1, 2008, ss. 7, 8, 18-21.1, 29, 35, 37-40, 42 and 44 of <u>An Act to Amend the Criminal Code (Criminal Procedure, Language of the Accused, Sentencing and Other Amendments)</u>, S.C. 2008, c. 18 (Bill C-13) will come into force. The balance of the Act has been in effect since receiving Royal Assent on May 29, 2008.
