1. Costs Thrown Away: Q.B.

In *Clink v. Leydier*, 2006 MBQB 208, the court makes an order settling the amount of "costs thrown away" when the petitioner sought and obtained by agreement an adjournment on the day a trial was set to commence.

4. Expansion of the Scope of the Child Support Recalculation Service

Further to last month's notice, Manitoba and Canada finalized an agreement on July 19, 2006 designating the Child Support Recalculation Service as a "provincial child support service" pursuant to section 25.1 of the *Divorce Act*. The finalization of this agreement means that the Service can recalculate final *Divorce Act* child support orders and that the provisions of the *Child Support Guidelines Regulation, amendment*, Man. Reg. 87/2005, and the *Queen's Bench Rules, amendment*, Man. Reg. 92/2005, respecting recalculation of *Divorce Act* orders came into force that day.

5. Matrimonial Property On Reserve
