1. Provincial Court Amendments

Family proceedings in the Provincial Court of Manitoba are the subject of Bill 4, *The Provincial Court Amendment Act (Family Mediators and Evaluators.)* The Bill, introduced in the Legislature on November 26, 2007, would give the Provincial Court jurisdiction to order appointment of a designated mediator or family evaluator in family proceedings before it.

2. Bill 7 - Reporting Child Pornography

Bill 7, *The Child and Family Services Amendment Act (Child Pornography Reporting)* was introduced in the legislature on November 28, 2007. The effect of the proposed legislation is to add a definition of child pornography to *The Child and Family Services Act*, C.C.S.M. c.C80, and to include child pornography in the definition of when a child is "in need of protection." The Bill also creates a new reporting obligation for anyone who "reasonably believes" that material is or might be child pornography, but does not extend that obligation to privileged information obtained in a solicitor and client relationship.

3. Family Law Innovations

The Fall 2007 issue of *News & Views on Civil Justice Reform* focuses on Family Law Innovations. It is published by the <u>Canadian Forum on Civil Justice</u> and is available entirely (and free) <u>online</u>.

4. Motions Court Practice Tips

The "basic expectations that a Court has of counsel appearing on motions" are succinctly set out in the recent Ontario Superior Court decision in *Kaplun v. Kaplun*, 2007 CanLII 38396. The court sets out six reminders and then summarizes these as follows: "Motions court lists usually are long. For motions court to work efficiently and fairly, the court depends upon counsel observing the "Three Cs" - Courtesy, Civility and Co-operation." If you spend any time in motions court, you need to read this decision.
