# Property & Succession Update





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## **1.** Revisions to the Conveyancing Protocol

The Law Society's Conveyancing Practices Committee has recently approved a number of changes to the Western Law Societies Conveyancing Protocol (Manitoba), aimed at improving its efficacy and facilitating its wider use by Manitoba lawyers and lenders. Notable among the changes is deletion of the Power of Attorney requirement. Also, to respond to recent changes in the City of Winnipeg, a new process for dealing with the vendor's final water account is implemented. The revisions took effect on March 15, 2009.

## 2. Value of the Work Done Determines Amount Required to Vacate Lien: MBQB

In <u>3065488 Manitoba Ltd. et al v. Kirkstall Holdings Ltd.</u>, 2009 MBQB 45 the court granted the plaintiffs' application for a pending litigation order and set the amount to be paid into court to vacate the registration of the lien. The court rejected the respondent's argument that no action to realize a claim for lien could be filed because one of the plaintiffs was also a part owner of the land. To determine the appropriate amount to be paid into court pursuant to s.55(2) of *The Builders' Liens Act* the court looked at the value of the work done by the lien claimant, not the contract price set out in the lien. It found, among other things, that the value of work done equation cannot include damages for loss of reputation.

## 3. MLRC Proposes Changes to Succession Legislation

The Manitoba Law Reform Commission submitted its report *Posthumously Conceived Children: Intestate Succession and Dependants Relief; The Intestate Succession Act: Sections* 1(3), 6(1), 4(5), 4(6) and 5 to Minister of Justice and Attorney General on February 26, 2009.

The Commission recommends that *The Intestate Succession Act* and *The Dependants Relief Act* be amended to allow posthumously conceived children to inherit from and through a parent who has died intestate or be able to apply for financial support.

The Commission also recommends that the 15 day survival requirement in *The Intestate* 

*Succession Act* for persons who are alive at the intestate's death should also apply to posthumously conceived children and to persons who are conceived before and born after the death of an intestate. Finally, the Commission recommends that the method of distribution of an estate outlined in *The Intestate Succession Act* be amended to provide that when the survivors in the nearest degree of kinship are issue of paternal and maternal grandparents or great-grandparents and they are all of the same generation, they should share in the estate equally.
